Knowing my kids and husband looked forward to camp meeting each year, I suggested they go without me. My husband said no. I might hear something that would help.

At this point I wasn’t sure God loved me or listened to my prayers, but I talked to Him. “Lord, if You have something for me at camp meeting, You will have to find us a camper,” and I named my requirements; size, price, etc. Within two weeks, we had a camper. But I was not done. “Now Lord, You know I hate storms at camp meeting, and when it’s too hot or too cold. I need utopia this year.” I needed to know God loved me.

Sabbath morning at camp meeting was beautiful. My niece commented on the perfect weather saying, “Who ordered this?” I quietly said, “I did,” and proceeded to tell her of my prayer.

Later that Sabbath afternoon, the Wisconsin Academy drama team put on a play. A girl’s family was falling apart and she decided to end her life. The play showed good angels and bad angels hovering around her. Satan’s angels were telling her, “You’re no good. Why don’t you just end it all?” But God’s angels were saying, “Jesus loves you. He died for you. I know you feel really bad about things right now, but it will get better.” Then the girl prayed, “Jesus, help me!” Immediately God’s angels drove Satan’s angels away.

I started to cry. God would do that for me. By just saying, “Jesus, help me!” Jesus would drive Satan away. Jesus loved me and would never leave me. This experience wasn’t some magic transformation, but it gave me hope.

Secret Power

Pentecost. Just the word brings a mental picture of crowds from around the world hearing the disciples preach about Jesus in their own language, then standing in line to be baptized, all in one day.

What was the secret power of their preaching? Here were unschooled men having the ability to reach young and old, Jew and Gentile, drawing thousands to repent and be baptized. What caused the church to have explosive growth back then while we have such small growth today?

John was there. Listen to what he says in I John 1:1-4, NKJV.

"That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, concerning the Word of life... That which we have seen and heard we declare to you... And these things we write to you that your joy may be full."

Here was the secret. Here is the reason they effected so many lives. They had seen, heard, and experienced Jesus personally. Intimately. This was no theory they had read or heard somewhere. What they shared was based on their current personal experience with Jesus.

When the followers of John the baptist asked Jesus what they should say to their teacher who was suffering in prison, Jesus told them to share what they had seen and heard. (Matthew 11:2-6) When the demoniac was delivered and pleaded to go with Jesus, Jesus told him to return home to his friends and tell them what the Lord had done for him. (Mark 5:18-19)

The simple testimony of a person daily experiencing God has far more convicting power than an eloquent sermon or well-drafted Bible study by someone with no personal relationship with God. Notice how the high priest and elders were effected when they heard two disciples share their faith.

"Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were unlearned and ignorant men, they marveled; and they took knowledge of them, that they had been with Jesus." Acts 4:13

Is it obvious to others that you and I have been with Jesus? It is the only way to be effective in reaching our friends and neighbors. We must take time each day getting close to Jesus. Only He can make our witness effective.

Few people go to camp meeting to sweat. But what if you had a great reason?





FINANCIAL UPDATE

The statistics listed below show a decrease in giving for both tithe and Wisconsin Budget as we begin 2012.

The recently voted 2012 budget contains many of the cost saving features of 2011. Thus far, total conference expenses are running under budget, yet I foresee another tight budget year. Once again we must rely on good stewardship of the funds God has given, and God's blessing to help us meet this year's goals.

We recently contracted with Michigan Conference to run a summer magabook program in the Milwaukee area. Approximately 20 students will have the opportunity to canvass, find Bible study interests, place truth-filled literature in homes, and earn scholarship money for their schooling.

Wisconsin Academy continues to enjoy enrollment of over 95 students. We still have some to go before reaching a balanced budget. Plans to balance the budget include a further increase in enrollment, bringing an industry to offset worthy student needs, and active fundraising by the academy's development director.

The challenges are big, but our God is bigger. We are committed to moving forward under God's guidance to finish the work here in Wisconsin. You are an important part of this work. Thank you for your continued prayer, participation, and faithful support.


