Giving Hope to Kids

A movement is growing in Wausau to help provide bedding for kids that go to bed each night without a bed. As of June 2018, thirty-six beds have been delivered by The Shepherd's House Seventh-day Adventist Church. Jamie Fisher shares her story of inspiration, support, and impact of Beds 4 Kids.

Inspired to Help

As the clutches of winter were slipping away, a surprise came in April. Pastor Tom Michalski saw a YouTube video about a Seventh-day Adventist church in Canada engaging the community and helping their needs. He sent the video to Jamie and she knew it was something their church could do in Wausau. She had been asking God for an opportunity to serve the community and share the Gospel. Now she felt His leading and was interested in providing beds for kids who need them. Another ministry, Sleep in Heavenly Peace, makes and delivers beds to families that need them for their children. Jamie and Pastor Tom felt that their church could buy and deliver beds in a similar fashion. On a Sabbath morning Pastor

Tom preached on Isaiah 58 and then Jamie presented the concept of Beds 4 Kids to the church. They enthusiastically supported this program. Jamie says, "it is an answer to my prayers and the prayers of my church." That Sabbath \$2,000 were pledged and Beds 4 Kids began formal operation. The following week a thousand dollars was collected and since then over \$7,000 has been raised.

Getting the Right Bed

Beds 4 Kids is designed to be a simple process for delivering beds to families. However, the smooth process is a result of in-depth start up work. Prices,

accounting, delivery teams, and referrals all need to be in place before beds can begin to go out to the community. Chief among these initial components is finding a bed supplier. God calls us to be good stewards, and Jamie knew that an affordable bed would allow the church's funds to aid more kids. Although there is a high saturation of bedding and mattress suppliers in Wausau, there were none within the church's price range. Their budget was around \$200, but the lowest price was a minimum of \$220. Most asked much high prices per bed, and the cost would burn through the church's operational funds. After much
