Prayer Brings Surrender - Part 2

Although raised in a loving Adventist home, Rob turned to partying, drinking and using drugs most of his teen and early adult years. Through the grace of God and the faithful prayers of his grandmother, mother, and wife, Rob eventually accepted Jesus and was baptized. He gave up smoking, chewing, weed, drink, and thought life was going great, but the battle was not over.

Unfortunately I took my eyes off Jesus. In Matthew 12:43-45 Jesus said, “When an unclean spirit goes out of a man, he goes through dry places, seeking rest, and finds none. Then he says, ‘I will return to my house from which I came.’ And when he comes, he finds it empty, swept, and put in order. Then he goes and takes with him seven other spirits more wicked than himself, and they enter and dwell there; and the last state of that man is worse than the first.” That is exactly what happened. I got fired, accused of thievery, so decided to move to another area. I quit going to church, but my wife continued faithfully taking the children to church. I’m extremely sorry now. I really dropped the ball when my family needed me the worst.

Though I didn’t attend church, God didn’t leave me and He told me to start praying. I would lay in my bed and pray every

night for my family. I prayed God would watch over and bless me. I prayed God would help me overcome chewing tobacco and my swearing. There was a real battle in my mind.

Finally, I started coming back to church and getting to know the people. I was really playing church, but as the pastor and elders preached week by week, the Holy Spirit led them to say just what I needed to hear. Each Sabbath I wanted in the worst way to make a complete surrender to God, but after the service each Sabbath I would walk out to the car, and when no one was looking take a dip of tobacco. Swearing and dipping tobacco were my biggest battles. I wanted victory. I prayed and pleaded, “Lord, how do you make all this

work: righteousness by faith... obeying the ten commandments... claiming the promises...how does this all come together?” This went on for several years.

One Sabbath after a special communion service I remember praying, “Oh God, please, create in me a clean heart! Change me Lord. Please change me! I’m tired. I need You!” Afterwards I went to the car and took another dip. The next morning, just when I was ready to take my first tobacco dip of the day, I paused. “God,” I prayed, “can You give me an hour without dipping, because I just can’t do this on my own. Please, give me one hour!” He gave me an hour! Then I prayed, “God, You did it! Give me another hour.” And He gave me another hour. He gave me a day, then two, and

three! As of this writing He's given me nine months without dipping tobacco. God has taken away the swearing too. I don't know how He did that.

In the Desire of Ages pages 330, 334, I read recently, *"Many who profess to be His followers have an anxious, troubled heart, because they are afraid to trust themselves with God. They do not make a complete surrender to Him; for they shrink from the consequences that such a surrender may involve....When the soul surrenders itself to Christ, a new power takes possession of the new heart. A change is wrought which man can never accomplish for himself. It is a supernatural work, bringing a supernatural element into human nature....A soul thus kept in possession by the heavenly agencies is impregnable to the assaults of Satan....We must inevitably be under the control of the one or the other of the two great powers that are contending for the supremacy of the world. It is not necessary for us deliberately to choose the service of the kingdom of darkness in order to come under its dominion. We have only to neglect to ally ourselves with the kingdom of light....Without a personal acquaintance with Christ, and a continual communion, we are at the mercy of the enemy, and shall do his bidding in the end."*

This is what made the difference: surrender and continual communion in prayer. For me, this has been like finding the keys to a Ferrari! This is how it works!
