

Marshfield Holds First Free Dental Clinic in Wisconsin

“Lord, what am I going to do?” prayed Julie Fuehrer, one of the guests at the Marshfield Free Dental Clinic. Julie was on Medicare and desperately needed oral surgery which she could not afford and her insurance would not cover. She contacted several dental clinics, but the cost was always way more than she could afford.

Then Julie heard a radio interview with a dentist, Dr. Randy Griffin, and the local Adventist pastor, Joseph Pericellia on Wisconsin Rapids Adventist Radio (WRAO FM). “I couldn’t believe it,” said Julie. “They were offering free dental care!” She heard the interview several times over the next couple of days and each time she found herself exclaiming, “Really! Really! Nobody does anything for free!” She could hardly believe it, but felt sure this was from the Lord; a direct answer to her prayer.

The first day of the clinic, Julie, along with nearly 100 others, arrived early to get in line. After receiving her free oral care she was overjoyed. “They did it for me,” said Julie with her lopsided gauze filled smile. Then she teasingly added, “I told them to give me a face-lift while they were at it, but obviously

I didn’t get it. Guess I’ll have to wait for heaven for that.” Julie was delighted to meet Dr. Randy Griffin and Pastor Pericellia who had conducted the radio interview she heard. Pastor Pericellia has made arrangements to meet Julie in the near future and let her share her story on the radio. She is also interested in learning more about the Adventist church.

Many people on fixed incomes drove from as far as two hours away to avail themselves of this free dental service. They heard about it from friends, read about it in the newspaper, and saw posters in post offices and workplaces. A taxi

cab driver who came said he was complaining about his toothache to a customer he was transporting, and the customer told him about the free clinic. One lady said someone from the welfare office told her about it. A school bus driver said he heard about it from kids talking about a free dental clinic on his bus route.

Volunteer Jim Parish visited with a man who had experienced several recent deaths in his family. When it was time for his dental care, Jim handed him a GLOW tract. As the man read the title, “Where is God When I’m Hurting,” tears welled up in his eyes. “If you want to

come back to my table after your dental work, I'd be happy to pray with you," offered Jim. The man did come back. As volunteers take shifts, the man was able to visit this time with Pastor Michael Ehm. Pastor Ehm was able to pray for and share his testimony with the man and he really warmed up. Pastor Ehm invited him to join his group Bible study. They eagerly shared contact information, and plan to meet together again soon for lunch.

Obeida Ehm, one of three volunteer interpreters at the event, assisted about 12 guests with their language needs. The interpreters were able to spend extended time visiting with the people they helped, and Obeida was able to set up Bible studies with three ladies. "I enjoyed every single minute helping with this event," said Obeida.

Dr. Arlene Gayle, an Adventist Oncologist from Marshfield, led out in organizing this event, the first of its kind in Wisconsin. "It

is a lot of work, but well worth it," said Arlene "We came up against some demonic forces, and we have seen how God has dispelled them all." She was also quick to say it would not have been possible without a lot of help from the great team of over 150 volunteers.

Volunteers came from all across Wisconsin to help with this two-day event. There was a place for everybody. Several young people were able to assist and gain a great experience. Grace Fitzpatrick, an 8th grader and member of the Fox Valley church said, "I've always been interested in dentistry, and as I attend the same church as

Dr. Conner, DDS, I've been even more interested. I worked with Dr. Tom and Wanda, a hygienist here. It was really cool because they let me suction, use the air and water for rinsing, mix formulas, and many other things. It was rewarding seeing people get their extractions and fillings taken care of for no cost. I want to be a missionary dentist like Dr. Conner was."

This two-day event, held May 14 and 15 in the Marshfield high school gymnasium provided services to the community valued at \$55,500.

- 152 people filled out forms for dental care
- 132 People received dental care (time prohibited 20 people from receiving dental care)
- 112 X-rays were taken
- 40 fillings done
- 63 extractions completed
- 48 teeth cleanings
