 There will be a cap for both evening family swim times at 150 people. If you would like to swim, make sure you arrive early.

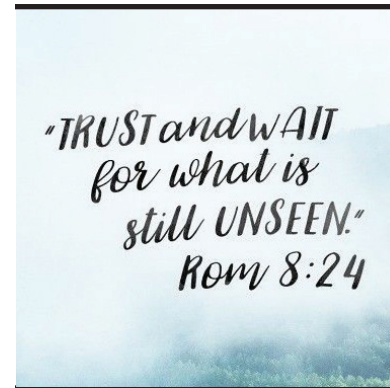

Rodney and Judy's Testimony



Rodney and Judy Rosenow have three sons and daughter-in-laws, eight grandchildren, and one great-grandson. Starting July 1, Rodney will be serving as a deacon, and Judy will be serving as a deaconess in the Shawano Adventist church.

"I always believed in God, but I never studied the Bible like we have been doing now," said Judy Rosenow with a pleased smile.

Judy grew up living in the country west of Shawano attending the local Lutheran church regularly with her family. When Judy grew up and got married, she continued to attend a local Lutheran church, and brought up their three sons in the church. Her husband, Rodney, was not a Lutheran, but

would attend church with Judy and the boys only when they were in a Christmas program, and when they got confirmed. "I always called Rodney a 'Christor,'" said Judy, "because he only attended church on Christmas and Easter.

Rodney would always want Judy to ask her pastor why they didn't worship on Saturday." They would always say it doesn't matter what day you go to church on," said Judy, "because every day is

a holy day." Judy was curious and interested in what Rodney seemed to believe, but he never wanted to go to his church or talk about it with her.

Rodney grew up the youngest of five boys on a farm near Gresham. His mother was an Adventist and took the boys to the Shawano Adventist church. "She tried to keep all of us boys in the church," said Rodney, "but only my oldest brother remained a Seventh-day Adventist." Rodney joined the Marines in 1964, but soon after his father had a heart attack, and Rodney got out on an honorable discharge to help on the farm. Judy and Rodney were married a year later. "Even though I didn't go to church all those years, I still believed the Sabbath day was Saturday," said Rodney. "Even when I had two stints put in my heart, and survived cancer, I always knew if it wasn't for the Lord I wouldn't be here."

In 2007 Rodney's mother became very sick and came to live with him and Judy. When she moved in Rodney stopped

Two years later when Rodney's mother died, Rodney attended her funeral which was in the Shawano Adventist church and met Pastor Rick Binford. “I knew the Lord was working on me when Pastor Binford asked if we wanted to do some Bible studies. Judy and I said yes right away, and we've been going to church ever since.”

Rodney and Judy were baptized into the Shawano Adventist church on July 16, 2016. “I'm sure my mother was praying for me to come back to the church all those years,” said Rodney. “I believe the Lord was with me even though I wasn't listening. I feel bad that mother never saw me return to the Adventist faith. I also feel bad I missed out on raising my children in this faith.”

Now Rodney and Judy regularly attend Bible studies together on Monday nights at the Shawano church, and study the Bible with Pastor Binford on Tuesday nights. “Pastor Binford has helped me see the ten commandments and the Sabbath day were changed, and our Lutheran catechism does not follow the Bible,” said Judy. “My relationship with Jesus Christ now is wonderful and getting stronger every day while I continue to study every word as it is written.”
