## **Evangelism for Madison**



Pictured above are the nine who were baptized as well as one profession of faith at the Madison Community church, following their evangelistic campaign.

As spring in 2018 began in Wisconsin, the Gospel sprang forth in the city of Madison. Through 22 sessions. spanning 31 days from April 5 to May 5, an evangelistic series was preached by Pastor Richard Halversen. The local church's pastor, Abraham Swamidass, shares his story of the evangelistic planning, leading, and reaping.

Planning and Planting Seeds One year ago, April 2017, Pastor Abraham and the Madison Community Seventh-day Adventist church prepared to share the Gospel. To this end, they sought out a location to host the first week of the evangelistic series. The Crowne Plaza Hotel

provided a prime location. God answered their pravers and the Hotel offered a rental package within their budget. Moreover, they received the first night free, extra space, and any necessary audio-visual equipment. With a location set, the church sought out a speaker.

Pastor Abraham was happy to connect with Pastor Richard and his wife Mary. Although they lived in Florida, they were willing to travel north to Wisconsin and spend the month there for evangelism. With the ministry team organized and an evangelist scheduled, the church looked to advertise to the Madison area through mail-brochures. Pastor Abraham was thankful

that the series was designated as Wisconsin Conference's major sponsored evangelistic series for 2018. This encouraged the local church to advertise and invite the community to hear the Gospel.

#### **Watering Thirsty Souls**

As the time came for the series to begin many prayers were offered on behalf of the potential lives to be changed. Over the course of the opening week, 70 first-time registrants came to the hotel venue. These non-SDA visitors were greeted warmly by members of the church. Moreover, many Adventist from other churches in the area attended the series and supported the local church's volunteers.

After the first seven consecutive nights, the series switched from the hotel over to the Madison Community SDA church. Twentynine visitors were still intrigued, and continued attending that weekend. Over the next couple weeks, there was a regular group of twenty attendees. These twenty individuals were engaged by the Advent message. Despite the "typical drop-out rate after the first week," Pastor Abraham was hopeful that God would continue to work in the hearts of those who continued listening to the Gospel.
