# JACKIE JACKSON: I'M DAILY SUSTAINED BY SCRIPTURE

me but verse 44 seems to state the impractical. For example, when working for an individual as a research assistant, I encountered resistance with keeping the Sabbath and isolation in the workplace. Some colleagues were condescending and even spoke negatively about me. God's scripture instructed me to not only bring the issue to Him in prayer, but to love them! I discovered this task neither easy nor natural. Thankfully, God constantly instructed me in these matters to "trust in the Lord with all *my* heart, and lean not on *my* own understanding; in all [my] ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct *my* paths." Proverbs 3:5, 6.

Moreover, I thank God for His scripture because it reveals that my walk with Christ is not to be one based on emotion. Instead, it is based on the principle of love which focuses on the salvation of every person on this planet. God's scripture discloses that my duty is to Him and to help others heavenward through the Holy Spirit. If they curse, hate, or spitefully use me, I pray for God's mercy upon them and that His Holy Spirit will change their wicked ways. I hope to show God's love to everyone I meet and to continually be filled with the Holy Spirit. This is NOT an easy task but it is the burden that God has blessed me with through the ministry of His Word.
