Why do prayers often get answered quickly when a group of people are interceding for a common cause? Maybe it is because our human hearts are the most like Jesus when we are looking out for someone else's benefit. Maybe it is because Jesus knows that rifts between church members close when they pray together and He's looking for His people to be reconciled, unified, and healed. Maybe it is because Jesus told us to pray for others and He likes to see us take Him at His word. Sometimes we intercede for many and sometimes for just one. The following story is shared with permission:

One of the girls at Wisconsin Academy gave her life to Jesus last summer before returning to school. She proudly posted on Facebook that she was giving Jesus a try. Many of the faculty at Wisconsin Academy were excited for her and her new journey.

Then, one day this same girl was talking to me in my office and declared, "I'm done with

Two days later, out of the blue, the student returned to my office with a glow to her face. She said, "Mrs. Dean, I've been listening to my gospel music, reading my daily devotional, and I'm getting closer to God. I'm working on it."

Soon after, this sweet girl asked me to pray with her for a friend in the dorm who had just lost someone to death. After prayer, she showed me a song she wrote for her grieving friend - a song meant to encourage her friend to stay close to Jesus. Here are some of those lyrics:

Jesus. I'm done!"
You can imagine the deep sadness I felt to hear those words. Here was a student coming to a Christian academy and making a choice to give up on God. What could be more devastating?

I went to the next faculty meeting and without giving out the student's name, asked the team to intercede for her. We

The test bulb glowed. "They must be straight up and down for them to make contact," he said. Then, installing the unit in its box, he touched the switch. Noiselessly the light came on. Now our house is furnished with these noiseless switches.

How like some Christian, I thought. Their faith is so worn that the contact with God is often broken just when it is needed most. Loud, vain, and useless sounds of complaints come when things go wrong. What is needed is quiet steady prayer and faith that the God who fashioned them is near at all times, and that "all things work together for good."

God is waiting for us to make contact with Him (pray) for the light we need in the dark places. What is more, He will make us upright, so that our connection with Him will be firm.
