stood in line, waiting to congratulate one of Wisconsin Academy's newest graduates. The gym was full of people, loud and stuffy, and the graduate hadn't made it to her table yet. Then we saw her coming, so happy, and she started hugging people and everyone was laughing and crying, celebrating the moment. I was pushed to the background, not able to talk to her and tell her how happy I was for her.

As I stood there and watched, wishing for just a small moment of her time, I was struck by the fact that this is how I treat Jesus. I let other things crowd ahead of Him, giving my attention to what is most current, pressing, or begging for my attention.

Several years ago I read about an author who would read one chapter a day from one of the Gospels. Even in my busy life as a teacher, one chapter a day is very doable. So I began. I started with Matthew, went on to Mark, then Luke and John. When I was done, I did it again. And again. It was wonderful. A picture of Jesus emerged that

went deeper and wider than what I had seen before.

Now I see Jesus as a revolutionary, challenging the accepted beliefs. I see Him as always taking the time to give everyone His undivided attention. I see Him as a teacher so filled with wisdom that His stories are understood by children and yet with truths not completely comprehended by the most studied theologians.

But the most important picture that emerged was love, inconceivable love. Jesus loves the misfits, the impulsive Peter, the thief Zaccheaus, the adulterous woman covered with shame, and even the betrayer Judas. He loves those I would dismiss. He is love, so much love!

I wanted the words of Jesus with me all the time. I wanted those words to be in my heart so I could be more like Him. I decided to start memorizing Scripture – whole chapters. However, I couldn't seem to do it. The verses would be there one day, but not the next.

Then I started using Scripture songs in my classroom. Kindergarten was going to memorize a verse for every letter of the alphabet and the older students were going to learn Psalm 1. We started and would sing the songs every day and pretty soon all of us knew a song for every letter of the alphabet and Psalm 1.






