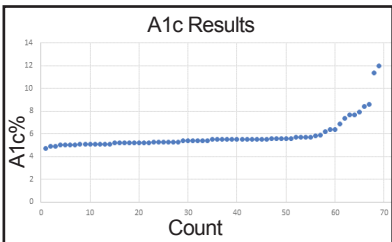

We did a total of 69 tests. Of these tests, the lowest was 4.7% and the highest was 12.0%. The average A1c result was 5.8%

Stay Close to the Scriptures



Pastor Bill and Gladys Ochs were introduced to the Adventist church through a literature evangelist, and were baptized May 21, 1983, in the Milwaukee Central Church, which happened to be the first church they were assigned to when they left the seminary in 1992. Bill and Gladys have spent their entire 25 years of pastoral ministry in Wisconsin.

In my first few months as a Christian, a friend sat down with me and showed me how to spend time alone with God, in the Word. He showed me how to study a passage of Scripture with a notebook, taking notes along the way. And he said to me, "The most important part of your daily Bible study is the last sentence you write. Each day, end your notes with the phrase, 'Today I need to:' and write down an action that you will take in response to what you have just learned in the Word."

This taught me how to be a doer of the Word. I learned right away that studying the Bible was never about warehousing information; it was about living out truth.

That's why James said, "Do not merely listen to the Word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." James 1:22 NIV "But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom, and continues in it — not forgetting what they have heard, but doing it — they will be

blessed in what they do." James 1:25 NIV

That's why Paul encourages his young friend Timothy, "... continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it." 2 Timothy 3:14 NIV

I want to encourage you to become a student of the Word. Spend time in the Bible every day. Let the words of Scripture influence the way you think, the way you believe, the way you behave. I heard someone once say that, for many Christians, the Bible is like the Terms of Service Agreement you get with a new software purchase. Before you can install, you always have to click the check-box that says, "I have read the Terms of Service and I agree with them." But nobody ever reads the terms of service. The same thing can be said for many Christians. They say they agree with everything in the Bible, but they don't read it.

I'm saying: Read it. You will be amazed at how much it
