The end of the school year came and those eighth graders graduated. We still do not have ten students to replace them, nor do we have ten kindergarteners to fill our upstairs classroom. Have we quit praying and asking God to send students and families to Petersen? Absolutely not. We are trusting Him to answer our prayer differently, in an unexpected way. Even if we end up rattling around in our classrooms next year we choose to continue to put our trust in Him.

OPENING DOORS FOR WAUTOMA CHURCH

The Almond Seventh-day Adventist church sent out several members of its church to help spread the Three Angel's Messages in a city and county where there is no current SDA church. Members of the Almond church. Eric and Carrie Anderson, Alan and Cheryl Anderson, and Kay Williams have partnered with members of three other churches to make this happen, including Sam Lopez and his family from the Stevens Point church. Steve and Cindy Bergman from the Oxford church, and Tim and Judy Schmidt from the Fox Valley church.

Many of those involved live near Wautoma and have been praying for an opportunity to do more for God. At camp meeting for the last several years, Lisa Isensee, the Wisconsin conference church planting coordinator, has been hosting a week long seminar series on church planting. After attending these meetings God opened the eyes of several people, that this is exactly where God wants us. After much prayer, steps were made to see where God would lead. One door after another began to open.

First, there remains a small Adventist run Community Center in Wautoma that still provides used clothes to people in need. This ministry has been active in Wautoma touching people's lives for generations. The second door God opened was finding a place for worship. A location for Sabbath services was found in a conference building run by an organization called CAP Services. The price of the room is FREE to nonprofit groups like churches. The third answer to prayer was found after looking at a demographics study of Wautoma and finding a fast growing Hispanic population. This door opened when Sam Lopez joined the group and began Bible studies with several Hispanic families in Wautoma.

As the group stepped out in faith, the Lord has blessed Wautoma's parent church, Almond, as well by adding even more precious souls to their church, filling all the recently vacated seats.


