Recently, I went with 48 others on a medical-based mission trip to Guatemala. Over the course of four very full days, we saw 1,844 patients.

There was one patient who especially stands out in my mind: She had one leg and no

shoes and was carried in by her family. She was seen in the medical area and then sent to learn how to use crutches. After a while she figured it out but was still barefoot. We searched for a while for a shoe that fit, but we couldn't find any. After searching around, I took a look at her foot and wondered if my

sneaker would fit. Taking off my shoe, I gave it to her to try. Lo and behold, the shoe fit! We were so happy that we cried and prayed and thanked God for providing a solution to her problem.

Now I was stuck with one shoe, but I was too full of joy to care. The mayor of Taxisco of Santa Rosa municipality and his family came to our camp and enjoyed chiropractic care and massages. His aunt, who was visiting at the time, heard about how I had given my shoe to this woman with one leg. She went back home and when she returned, she had brought two pairs of shoes with her— ones that were my size. What a blessing! It just goes to show how God provides, even when we're not expecting anything.

Everyone present was blessed abundantly. It was a privilege to serve on this mission trip, to practice my Spanish and be a part of the mission: "One More For Christ/Uno Mas Por Cristo." And it was an honor to be the hands and feet for Christ. On top of it all, we found out at the end of our trip that over 400 people made decisions to accept Jesus into their lives.

Step by Step

HOW TO REGISTER ONLINE FOR CAMP

1. Go to wi.adventist.org/register
2. Click Log In or Sign up in the upper right corner of the site.
3. Once logged in, click the yellow button, "Check Availability" with the arrow on it.
4. Enter the dates you intend to stay. If you are registering for camp meeting 2019 be sure to enter the dates of June 14 - 24 if you intend to stay though Sunday.
5. Once you enter the dates, if you've registered before, a box will show at the top and say 1 or more available.
6. If the yellow available button appears, click on the drop down menu on the right hand side just above where it says total. Your site number should be listed there. You will want to select it. If you have not registered before simply fill in the information in the filter boxes on the left.
7. Once finished, click the yellow continue button.
8. At this point it will say you have 13 minutes to complete. Hit continue again.
9. Fill in your payment information, click agree, and then make reservation.
10. You should receive a confirmation email.

Please note: If you are trying to register after the last business day in July for a cabin or full-service site, your site will be listed as unavailable. At this point you will be added to the waiting list and you will be assigned a site in the order it arrived. PLEASE BE SURE TO SIGN UP AND PAY BEFORE TUESDAY, JULY 31, OR YOUR SITE FOR 2019 WILL BE LOST.
