"Well, the controls of an aircraft," he thought. "I'm a pilot. I fly with about three-hundred other pilots."

Then it hit him. "This airline is my mission field!"

He got me thinking... God has given me the same opportunity. My fellow pilots are my mission field too.

Airline pilots are usually paired together for a month at a time. We get to know each other, build rapport, and become friends.

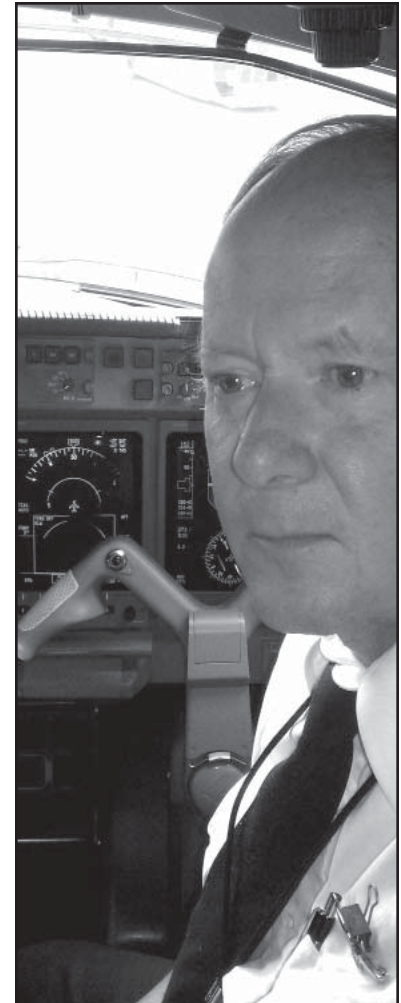
For me, talking with a friend is more effective than knocking on doors, handing out literature and leaving. That always felt like "hit and run" witnessing to me. Instead, I get to share the gospel and discuss it with them for about a month.

Over the last few years the question often comes up, "Why haven't you upgraded to captain?" The answer is that I couldn't keep Sabbath as a new captain with very little seniority. That usually leads to an explanation of what the Biblical Sabbath means and what a blessing it is.

We have been given so much light. It's such a great privilege for me to share it with my co-workers.
