In 2005 I was working at a boarding academy. I had been a chaperone on a recent mission trip to Guatemala. Near the end of the trip, I picked up a nasty intestinal bug. After a couple of weeks back in North America, I thought I was over the bug.

My mom was coming to visit me and we were planning to go camping for about a week. When she arrived, we packed up our things and strapped a canoe on top of my car. After a several hour drive through the mountains, a ferry ride, and another drive we arrived at the spot where we could park the car and put the canoe into the water.

We loaded our gear into the canoe and paddled across the lake to the campsite. The water was pristine and the scenery breathtaking. We pulled the canoe ashore at the campsite and set up. We had a really nice time exploring, making a meal, and just being in the wilderness. Then we turned in for the night.

My mom woke up in the middle

of the night to my moans of pain as I tossed in my sleeping bag. Apparently, I wasn't over that intestinal bug. We were very much in the wilderness without a good way to get medical help or to alleviate the pain. Between moans, I remember telling my mom that I was in too much pain to get in the canoe to go back to the car.

My mom quietly sat beside me in the darkness. Then she said that she was going to pray. I don't remember the words she

spoke. However, as she prayed for me, a warm sensation spread across my abdomen and peace came over my body. My mom says I was sound asleep shortly thereafter.

The next morning we made the journey back to a town to seek medical attention. Tests were done over the next couple of days, but nothing showed up. As far as the doctors were concerned there was no explanation for the pain that I had experienced. We praised

Baptismal Vows

Message From Our Treasurer BRIAN STEPHAN



This past Sunday at a special constituency of the Wisconsin Conference, a recommendation by the Executive Committee was voted to replace the waste-water treatment system at Wisconsin Academy. This is necessary as our current system is not only worn out

but can no longer meet new requirements as established by the DNR. The cost of the new system itself is \$277,000. Total cost with necessary repairs and decommissioning of the old system is projected to be a little under \$500,000. Previous estimates for this project have ranged from \$1,250,000 to \$2,000,000. We believe God has blessed us with this plan to take care of the wastewater needs at Wisconsin Academy.

The plans for the new system have been approved and construction is to start immediately. Our plan is to finish the project by the end of this year. To keep borrowing to a minimum the Executive Committee voted a challenge

to our constituency to raise \$150,000 by year-end if at all possible. We are asking that you help us reach this goal.
