As Grace and the little girl next door were riding their two-wheeled bicycles together, the little girl from next door began making fun of Grace because Grace still had training wheels on her bike. She taunted Grace

saying, “I am only five and I can ride without training wheels. You are six and still need training wheels, you must be dumb.”

Grace put up with this for a while, but finally said, “It's OK that I am six and still need training wheels on my bike because God has made us all different. **TWO WORSHIPPERS**

The prayer of the publican was heard because it showed dependence reaching forth to lay hold upon Omnipotence. Self to the publican appeared nothing but shame. Thus it must be seen by all who seek God. By faith--faith that renounces all self-trust--the needy suppliant is to lay hold upon infinite power.

No outward observances can take the place of simple faith and entire renunciation of self. But no man can empty himself of self. We can only consent for Christ to accomplish the work. Then the language of the soul will be, Lord, take my heart; for I cannot give it. It is Thy property. Keep it pure, for I cannot keep it for Thee. Save me in spite of myself, my weak, unchristlike self. Mold me, fashion me, raise me into a pure and holy atmosphere, where the rich current of Thy love can flow through my soul.

It is not only at the beginning of the Christian life that this renunciation of self is to be made. At every advance step heavenward it is to be renewed. All our good works are dependent on a power outside of ourselves. Therefore there needs to be a continual reaching out of the heart after God, a continual, earnest, heartbreaking confession of sin and humbling of the soul before Him.

Only by constant renunciation of self and dependence on Christ can we walk safely.
