

Jennie, new member of the Green Bay Church, is now enjoying her first camp meeting experience.

When I was a little girl of three, they called me "Jennie," and I spent time at Grandma's home. Grandma taught me the love of Jesus, and would read bedtime stories and pray with me each evening. Her love for me and her teaching me about the love of God has carried me through the ups and downs of my life. My Grandma was my lifeline.

I have lived in Missouri, Iowa, Arkansas and Wisconsin, and I have attended many churches, searching for that connection with God I learned from Grandma. Eventually, I found myself dissatisfied and not going to church at all. I moved back to

Wisconsin, again. After attending a church for two years and not being fed the way I felt I should be, I stopped going.

A few days later, I received a Revelation brochure in the mail. As I read it, this feeling came over me - I just had to go and see if this was what I needed. I called the 800 number and made a reservation. The first night, I was made to feel very welcome. As the speaker was speaking, I had flashbacks of things that Grandma had told me, but at the time I had not understood. I prayed, "God, are you trying to tell me something? Do I belong here?"

After many evenings, I asked to talk to the speaker. I needed to know if I could be saved again and have my name in the book of life...

I just had to talk to the Pastor of the SDA Church and ask if I would be welcome to become a member of his Church. He replied that they would be very happy if I wanted to become part of the church family. I knew right then and there that I had found what I had been missing and that this family was what I had been lacking in my soul.

I'm thankful that God has given me a way to better myself. I didn't belong anywhere. Now I have found my home and I feel complete, loved and bubbling over with joy! I now have a Father and a family!

In the end, what was given to me in the beginning of my young life from my Grandma's teachings, prayers and love for Jesus takes me full circle to find the joy and belonging that my Grandma had found years ago when Grandma visited the SDA church.

To me, being a Seventh-day Adventist is like living next door to God!

Baptismal Vows

Today is world-wide baptismal Sabbath. As individuals are baptized here at Wakonda, literally thousands around the world will also begin their new life in Christ. I want to encourage everyone to review the baptismal vows listed below, and choose again to love and follow the One who loves us so deeply.

1. I believe in God the Father, in His Son Jesus Christ, and in the Holy Spirit.
2. I accept the death of Jesus Christ on Calvary as the atoning sacrifice for my sins, and believe that through faith in His shed blood I am saved from sin and its penalty.
3. I renounce the world and its sinful ways, and have accepted Jesus Christ as my personal Savior, and believe that God, for Christ's sake, has forgiven my sins and given me a new heart.
4. I accept by faith the righteousness of Christ, recognizing Him as my Intercessor in the heavenly sanctuary, and claim His promise to strengthen me by His indwelling Spirit, so that I may receive power to do His will.
5. I believe that the Bible is God's inspired Word, and that it constitutes the only rule of faith and practice for the Christian.
6. I accept the Ten Commandments as still binding upon Christians; and it is my purpose by the power of the indwelling Christ, to keep this law, including the fourth commandment, which requires the observance of the seventh day of the week as the Sabbath of the Lord.
7. I look forward to the soon coming of Jesus as the blessed hope in my heart, and I am determined to be ready to meet the Lord, and to do all in my power to witness to His loving salvation, and by life and word to help others to be ready for His glorious appearing.

8. I accept the Biblical teaching of spiritual gifts, and believe that the gift of prophecy is one of the identifying marks of the remnant church.
9. I believe in church organization, and it is my purpose to support the church by my tithes and offerings, and by my personal effort and influence.
10. I believe that my body is the temple of the Holy Spirit, and I will honor God by caring for it, avoiding the use of that which is harmful, abstaining from all unclean foods, from the use, manufacture, or sale of alcoholic beverages, the use, manufacture, or sale of tobacco in any of its forms for human consumption, and from the misuse of or trafficking in, narcotics or other drugs.
11. I know and understand the fundamental Bible principles as taught by the Seventh-day Adventist Church. It is my purpose, by the grace of God, to order my life in harmony with these principles.
12. I accept the New Testament teaching of baptism by immersion, and desire to be so baptized as a public expression of faith in Christ and His forgiveness of my sins.
13. I accept that the Seventh-day Church is the remnant church of Bible prophecy, and that people of every nation, race, and language are invited and accepted into its fellowship. I desire to be a member in this local congregation of the world church.
