Thursday, June 23 **Meet Josh Jeresek**

n Monday, 133 people crammed into the small ceramics room in the basement of Cedar Lodge to hear Josh Jeresek present his seminar entitled "Natural Home Remedies." People were sitting on the floor, on tables, and standing in doorways, as he demonstrated natural ways to health.

Josh's interest in health began years ago. Josh Jeresek developed a strong interest in health food as a young man. Not knowing the Lord, he sought connection with the Rastafarian movement.

As Josh kept seeking a deeper spiritual walk, God led him one Sabbath to the Seventh-day Adventist Church in Winona, MN. Paul Hefty of the Winona Church then began a friendship with Josh and his fiancée Emily. Josh and Emily became intrigued by the Adventist



health message. On January 18, 2003, they were baptized. "The Winona church was a very loving and embracing church," Josh shared, "They loved Emily and me into the truth. They were patient with us, answered our questions and just loved us." Shortly after being baptized, Josh and Emily were married.

In 2007. Josh attended the ARISE institute in Michigan and was trained as a Bible worker. In 2008. he became a Bible worker for the

Stevens Point SDA Church. The church grew. "Stevens Point was a great experience. It was the best job I ever had. I learned a lot about life and ministry there."

In late 2009, Josh read a quote in The Ministry of Healing that tugged on his heart. It read. "Every person should have a knowledge of nature's remedial agencies and how to apply them" (pg. 127). In 2010, Josh felt a greater call to engage in medical missionary training. Josh trained at Uchee Pines and is now a lifestyle educator. "My wife Emily and I wanted this type of training for a long time, but debt kept us from pursuing the medical missionary training. But God was leading. We were soon out of debt and on our way to Uchee Pines. We went there to be healthy ourselves and wanted others to learn to be healthy from what we would share."

After 133 people attended his seminar on Monday. Josh said, "I was humbled by how many people came to hear about the right arm of the gospel. The Lord let me know that it had nothing to do with me but that it was all about the information that people came to learn." Josh's final seminar will be held on Friday at 4pm in Fireside Lodge.
