selfishness and lust. Why doesn't He come?

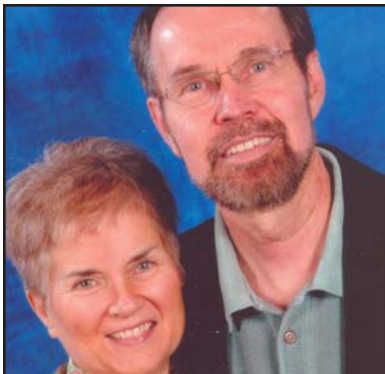
I take courage in His love for the children of Israel and trust He will be as patient with me, my family and friends as we flounder and get ensnared.

Dr. Richard M. Davidson is Professor of Old Testament Interpretation at the Theological Seminary at Andrews University. Born in California, Davidson attended Loma Linda University, graduating in 1968 with a BA in theology. Two years later he earned his MDiv summa cum laude from Andrews. He also received his doctorate in Biblical Studies at Andrews in 1981.

Daughter of missionary parents, Dr. Jo Ann Davidson began her teaching career as a home-schooling mom. After completing a PhD from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, Jo Ann became the first woman teacher in the Theology Department at Andrews Theological Seminary. Jo Ann has published several books, and is a past president of The Adventist Theological Society.

Davidsons have two adult children and enjoy backpacking, mountaineering, mountain biking, cross-country skiing, and tennis.

**Anna & Ferdinand Stahl**

Anna was a Swedish waitress in a Milwaukee restaurant. Ferdinand was from Germany and came daily to eat lunch and visit Anna. Soon they fell in love and married.

In 1901, a colporteur visited the Stahls and sold them *The Great Controversy* book. They read it, took Bible studies, and the truths took root in their hearts. Ferdinand gave up his job to begin keeping the Sabbath, and soon they were baptized.

Shortly after this, they moved to Madison where Ferdinand took a one-year nurses course at the Sanitarium. Then he began to talk of the mission field. "I want to go to the hardest place there is," he wrote Ellen White.

Today across the Peruvian Andes there are scores of Adventist schools, churches and medical facilities testifying to the faithful labors of the Stahls, and they are known as The Apostle To The Indians.

Stahl's were a major force in helping demolish the cast system in Peru through education and the gospel.
