
Ruth Wright is now secretary to the presidential, secretariat, and ministerial departments. Originally from Maryland, she has a degree in Secretarial Science.

# Milwaukee Launches City-Wide Evangelism Program

Nearly 400 members from the 13 Milwaukee area Adventist churches met on Sabbath afternoon, January 16, for a two-hour music festival and soul-winning rally held at Milwaukee Junior Academy.

The six pastors serving in the greater Milwaukee area--Duane Brown, Steve Cook, Alphonso Green, Jr., Bill Ochs, David Scofield and Orlando Vasquez-introduced some of their recently baptized members and shared plans of their churches in 1993.

Eight evangelistic crusades have been scheduled for Milwaukee in 1993 by these churches: Kenosha/Racine; Milwaukee Central; Milwaukee Central Spanish; Milwaukee North Spanish; Milwaukee Southeast Spanish; Racine Spanish; Sharon; and Waukesha.

Evangelists scheduled to date include Auldwin Humphrey and Herbert Larsen from the Lake Union Conference, and Leo Schreven from the Adventist Media Center. Other evangelists will be selected in coming weeks.
