During Camp Pitch, pastors will distribute the brochures to homes and businesses in Westfield, inviting folks personally to camp meeting.



"It tells me we need to do a better job in interacting with the community here so that people really know who we are," said Pastor Donovan Davis.

If all goes well, Visitors' Day may become a Wisconsin Camp Meeting tradition.



Special brochures were designed to invite Westfield residents to camp meeting. Pastors will distribute them the week of Camp Pitch.




## Recycling comes to camp meeting

## Camp meeting guidelines and rental policies

# To make camp meeting safe and enjoyable for everyone, please observe the following:

- Park only one vehicle by each campsite.
- · Camp in assigned areas only.
- Avoid moving personal property during Sabbath hours.
- Purchase Sabbath meal tickets at the administration office before sundown Friday.
- Observe modest dress and behavior. Wear shorts and play clothes only during playtime, swimwear only at the beach.
- Observe speed regulations and handicapped parking areas.
- Know the location of the first aid building (west of the dining hall). Nurse's hours: 8-9 AM; 12:30-1:30 PM; 6:00-7:15 PM. Report all emergencies to the main office.
- Parents, pick up your young children within 15 minutes after the close of their programs.
- Prevent soil erosion by leaving pine needle coverings around cabin and camp sites intact.
- Play camp pianos and organs only with approval.
- Remember that radios and televisions are not appropriate during camp meeting.
- Respect the boundaries of Camp Go Seek—help us be good neighbors!

#### **Beach rules:**

- Beach is closed except at times specified in the daily CAMP LAMP.
- Adults must accompany children age 12 or younger.
- Swimmers age 12 and over should wear robes to and from the beach. Please wear modest, onepiece swimsuits. Swimwear is restricted to the beach area only.
- No swimming after 6 PM or on the Sabbath.

#### **Rental provision:**

 Any renter shall lose his or her rights to re-rent or remain in any accommodation if: (a)the accommodation is found to be occupied by children or young people without proper chaperonage (as defined by the controlling committee); or (b) the individual is found in violation of any principle of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

#### Remember, absolutely no:

- Tobacco, alcohol, or drugs.
- · Pets.
- · Candles or campfires.
- Selling, soliciting, or promoting of any objects or projects.
- Bicycles (for use by hired messengers only).
- · Fishing.
- Weapons of any kind, including water guns and water toys.
