
NET '96 STORIES

TO THE UKRAINE WITH LOVE

od lays the burden of the needs Jof the work on various people's hearts. Berton Crary has a keen interest in helping the people in the Ukraine. The background of his interest in the work in eastern Europe began with participation in an evangelistic campaign in Moscow. He let the General Conference know that he would be willing to organize a crusade in a place of their choosing. They chose the Kmelneski area in

eastern Ukraine and the result was a successful crusade of about 150 baptisms.

Berton has kept close to the people of that area and has provided help for them in clothing and medical supplies. On December 10 another container full of clothing and medical supplies will arrive. The container will deliver about 1200 boxes of clothing with about 30,000 articles of clothing. A substantial amount of medical supplies will also be delivered.

Don Corkum, Wisconsin Conference President, has an interest in this area as well. In May, 1995, he conducted pastoral training programs there. He became acquainted with the pastor of Kmelneski and many of the new members. He understands the tremendous need that exists.

Many people from Wisconsin have contributed to this project. They have sent clothing and some have donated hours of labor to get the clothing ready. Berton and his wife, Joyce, have put in many hundreds of hours to get this container ready. Young people from the Petersen Elementary School in Columbus came and helped load the container.

The Crary's are planning to send future container loads to this and perhaps other areas of need. They will be relocating their base of operation to available space at Wisconsin Academy. Your clothing and volunteer labor will be greatly appreciated to make these projects a continuing success. WISCONSIN'S STANDING IN THE NAD

There are 58 local conferences in the NAD. The Wisconsin L Conference is No. 47 in size of membership. Are you surprised there are 17 conferences that are smaller than us? Our total tithe as of August 1996 was \$2,658,409.68 which ranked 38th in the NAD (obviously nine rankings higher than our membership), with a per capita of \$442.11 which was 15th in NAD. That is 32 rankings higher than our membership. Wisconsin Adventists contributed to the World Mission funds

\$151.649.38 which was 42nd in the NAD with the per capita of \$25.22 which was third in the NAD. Our conference is a leader. The Wisconsin Conference is a strong financial supporter of the worldwide mission of the Adventist Church. Let us praise God together for these accomplishments.
