# HARVEST 90 NEWS

Withee - Wendell Springer is conducting a Kenneth Cox Video Crusade in the Adventist Living Center chapel. Fourteen non-SDA's attended the first night, and 24 the second night! There has been an average of 12-14 non-Adventists in attendance each evening.

Poy Sippi - In this village of 400 residents, Ken Knutsen is holding a Revelation Seminar. Ken reports an average of 8 to 9 non-SDA's at the evening meetings.

Richland Center - David Livermore has completed a Family Seminar on the UW campus in Richland Center. Twenty-two non-SDA's visited the Richland Center Church early in March. David is continuing his study with these individuals in a Daniel Seminar now being held in the Richland Center Church.

Baraboo - Twenty-nine non-SDA's attended the opening night of the Kenneth Cox video crusade being conducted in Baraboo by George Shaver.

Lake Country Company - Steve Cook reports 6 to 8 good interests developing from a Prophecy Seminar, in spite of a movement to stop this seminar by local residents who made more than 50 complaint calls to the school where the Seminar is conducted and put a notice in the local newspaper advising readers not to attend.

BOOKMOBILE LOSES BUMPER
- BUT ALL IN GOD'S

Bookmobile experience
as follows:

"It was one of those days. We had completed 4 Bookmobile stops and were heading to our 5th and last stop. We had been through it all that day. We left the Clearwater Church early that morning with several inches of new, clean, white snow on the ground. Our first "adventure" came as we tried to enter the main highway - we got hung up on the ice and spent several minutes just spinning our wheels.

At our next stop, we received a telephone message that we should skip the next stop for reasons known only to message giver. Later we drove into fog and heavy snow. For a few miles we moved at a turtle's pace with near zero visibility. On the stops we made, the sales were well attended and our courage was good as we headed toward the final stop.

As we were driving along, a man in a van pulled up beside us and pointing to the Bookmobile mouthed a message to us. "Your bumper fell off!" Quickly we stopped to survey the damage. Sure enough, the bumper

was gone, as was the spare tire attached to it. We started to hike back along the side of the road looking for the lost bumper. Time was getting away from us. We were going to be late for the next sale. About a mile behind us we found the bumper laying on the highway.

Now the challenge was how to get back to the trailer with that heavy piece of equipment. We started back to the trailer carrying the bumper between us. A few minutes later a car stopped and two men jumped out. Opening their trunk they helped load the bumper onto their car and then took us to the trailer. Just as we were loading the bumper onto the truck, a second car stopped and a young man climbed out, calling us by name. We immediately recognized him as member from the church we had not stopped at because of the telephone message.

Checking at the church earlier that day, he had waited some time for the Bookmobile and then returned again to see if we had arrived. As he drove down the highway, he watched for the Bookmobile along the way, hoping he could catch us at a later stop. He had nearly convinced himself that he would

not find us and felt badly about not getting the books he wanted, when he saw us beside the road.

We knew then that the Lord was still in control. Right there, parked beside the highway, we had "mini" sale and then left to meet our next appointment where the people were still patiently waiting. What a joy to do the work of the Lord! many times we can see His leading, in the events of our day, in answered prayer and even in a lost bumper!"
