Wisconsin Conference Science Fair

The 5th annual Wisconsin Conference Science Fair was held on Sunday, March 15 in the gymnasium of Wisconsin Academy. More than 600 students and adults enjoyed the activities beginning at 9:00 a.m.

William Barrett, chief engineer for a Milwaukee manufacturing firm and inventor, promoted the engineering occupation and showed pictures of some of the equipment he has developed.

Dr. Margarita Mattingly and Bruce Lee from the Andrews University Physics Department captivated the audience with physics "toys" from Mr. Lee's Toy Box.

Most of the 22 Wisconsin church schools as well as Wisconsin Academy were represented in the 103 science projects on display. An increase in enthusiasm for the Science Fair was evident by the increase in projects from last year's all time high of 72 exhibits. Wisconsin Academy scholarships were awarded to all students who followed the instructions and completed the criteria.

Other activities during the day included the paper helicopter flight contest, the clothes pin airplane and the "Grand Can" car race. Tee shirts designed and made by the graphic arts department at the Academy and cash prizes were awarded the winners in each category.
