

Prayer Warriors and a Big God

It all started several years ago when two prayer warriors made a decision. They covenanted with God to come to church 30 minutes early every Sabbath to plead with God for more members. The Watertown Seventh-Day Adventist Church was not growing as fast as they had hoped. These prayer warriors firmly believed God had a plan and they wanted to know what it was.

Over time, three new people showed up! These three all came for different reasons but felt they needed to be in church. One was a refugee; one remembered, from their youth, that a grandmother was a Seventh-day Adventist and felt a need to be baptized; and one came after being convicted by watching “The Days of Noah.”

The members got excited! Bible studies began taking place. More people joined the two warriors in prayer after two of the visitors were baptized. More people started attending and now wanted to help with evangelism. One member decided the Lord was leading them to fund a Bible worker, so they gave \$20,000. Another person added \$6,000 to the fund and a Bible worker was hired.

Meanwhile, Jane Foll, a leader in the Watertown church, laid out a plan to get the total church involved in witnessing. She called it “Ministry Action Plan” or MAP for short. This was not just another church program. The object was to get every member doing what they

had a passion to do even if there was no activity like that presently taking place. And everyone meant every one. The young people in the church are NOT the church of the future; they are the church of the present.

The members responded to MAP in diverse ways. The Bible worker needed contacts, so two families pooled resources to sponsor a blanket mailing of the Watertown area inviting residents to send for The Great Controversy. Forty-nine residents responded after much more prayer was offered! One group of adults along with young people went door-to-door with questionnaires asking church neighbors how the church could help them. Prayer was offered at the door and a number of people requested Bible studies. Another group of adults and youth began handing out Glow tracts. The young people designed cards to

invite neighbors to a Christmas program, in which they were prominently featured. One member became the featured speaker at a Baptist Women's Retreat, and another began sending out birthday cards.

Sabbath afternoon activities are now being planned around door to door evangelism. The church is also praying for a high-powered radio station. Through the questionnaire, interest in cooking classes and a health seminar were indicated and the church is planning to host these events.

The excitement has been especially contagious with the young people in the church, and several have recently been baptized. The midweek Prayer Meeting attendance has grown from 5-6 to 20-25 with the youth participating in singing, reading and praying. They

We are very grateful to God for what has happened at Camp Wakonda, and we thank all those who left a mark or touched people's lives with their contributions of time, resources, and love.

You, as part of the Adventist family in Wisconsin, are now invited to participate in essential projects to renovate and build new permanent structures. Whether volunteering or donating, every one of us is called to be part of the history that is written by our generation. Now is our time. God has given us a unique opportunity to use our spiritual gifts. I invite you to reflect on God's blessings and respond accordingly.

This year our camp meeting theme is, "Come, Follow Me." At the beginning of His ministry on earth, Jesus invited his disciples to be part of His missionary team. One by one they responded to His call and, after three and a half years of training and assisting Him, He sent them as His ambassadors into the whole world.

We are part of God's kingdom today because of their response to the call: "Come, and follow Me." Now it is our privilege to respond to the same call. Jesus needs new disciples in every generation in our assigned territory. He wants us to follow Him and to be actively involved in the process of making disciples. We cannot make disciples; the Holy Spirit does that. But we need to invite others to become His disciples.

As we get closer to camp meeting time, I invite you to reflect on these inspired paragraphs, written by Ellen White, related to camp meeting preparation.

"Our annual camp meetings are of great importance to all who can attend them. They should feel that the Lord requires this of them. If God's people neglect the privileges he has provided for them to become strong in him, they will grow weaker and weaker and have less and less desire to consecrate all to him! The object of these holy convocation meetings is that the brethren may be separated from business cares and burdens and devote a few days exclusively to seeking the Lord."

"When the grace of God reigns within, the soul will be surrounded with an atmosphere of faith and courage and Christlike love, -an atmosphere invigorating to the spiritual life of all who inhale it. Then we can go to the camp-meeting, not merely to receive, but to impart. Every one who is a partaker of Christ's pardoning love, -every one who has been enlightened by the Spirit of God and converted to the truth, will feel that for these precious blessings he owes a debt to every soul with whom he comes in contact. Those who are humble in heart, the Lord will use to reach souls whom the ordained ministers cannot approach. They will be moved to speak words which reveal the saving grace of Christ."

FINANCIAL UPDATE

It's a beautiful time of year as flowers begin to emerge and things start to green up. With the better weather the building projects and renovations are in full swing at Camp Wakonda. Final foundations have been poured for our division buildings as well as the concrete floors. Many of you have come to camp on the Sunday Work Days, and other days, preparing for the Maranatha volunteers who arrived on April 17. A big thank-you to all volunteers who have worked hard to be ready for this important project at the camp!

We appreciate the support you have shown with your offerings to this endeavor as well. Through March, we have received \$116,601 for "Building Our Future" at Camp Wakonda. The offerings have been coming in at the rate of approximately \$20,000 per month. If we can sustain this over the next couple of years we will be able to complete this project debt free!

We expect most cabin renovations and new construction of a Medical Building/Camp Store can be completed by the end of next year as long as the funding continues to come in.

While larger donations are needed and welcome, I believe we can achieve our funding needs by all of us consistently doing what we can manage each month. The Lord too is adding His blessing as \$15,000 worth of materials, needed for our children's divisions structures, was donated by one of the suppliers.

Thank you again for your support and prayers during this major update of our conference camp!

May God continue His blessing on our Conference as well as your local congregation as we continue to proclaim the good news of a loving Savior to those around us.




